This was just the start of the excitement, with celebrations to mark Andalucía day soon following.

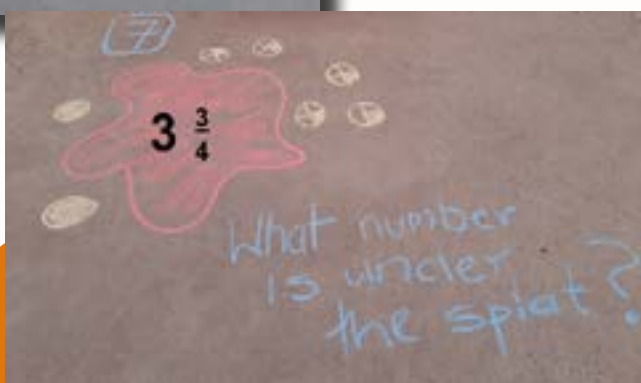
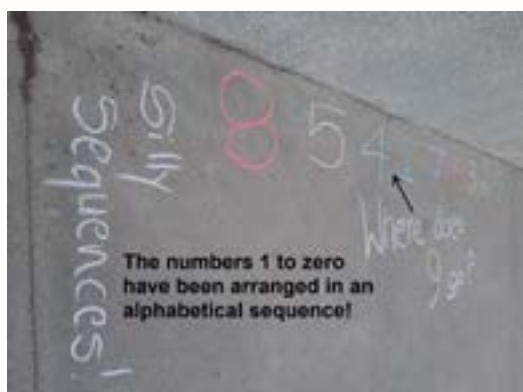
